Modality and participation in the virtual meetings

- Two virtual meetings per region in 2019.
 - 1st meeting: UIS, regional organizations and representatives from the Member States who attended the last TCG meeting (November 2018) are expected to present the work accomplished up to date.
 - 2nd meeting (after TCG 6): present the results of the TCG 6th meeting to all countries of the region.

Take away

- Very positive as it made possible to reach countries and organizations that can not participate in the TCG meetings.
 - Participation of around 160 representatives from countries and regional organizations.
- Several questions during the meetings and then follow-up consultations from non-TCG countries on:
 - Need of continue improving harmonization between national, regional and global monitoring frameworks. This issue was raised in several national presentations as well.
 - Data reporting mechanisms (e.g. how does my country report on indicator 4.x.x?) and missing data in the UIS database
 - Methodology of specific indicators



A Global Coalition for Education Data (GDC-ED)

Goal: Mobilize and align all resources, domestic or international, behind common approach, and activate public-private partnerships for data production and sharing in a strategic and coordinated way at reasonable costs.

- Coalition would provide:
 - a. a more effective system for gathering funding;
 - b. a better mechanism for sharing information, and for serving as a broker between users, innovators, suppliers, and funders; and
 - c. grant the funding for global coordination

- 1. Finalize the country's information systems mapping
- 2. Continue/convene the different streams of work invited other partners as needed
- 3. Form Working groups with partners for the further development of the topics
- 4. Prepare a consolidated work plan
