

### TECHNICAL COOPERATION GROUP ON SDG 4 INDICATORS (TCG) WORKING GROUPS AND WORKPLANS FOR 2024-2026

CONCEPT NOTE

29 APRIL 2024

#### Introduction

With the adoption of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) at the UN General Assembly in September 2015 and the Education 2030 Framework for Action (FFA) at the UNESCO General Conference in November 2015, attention has turned to the development of processes and plans to monitor progress towards the targets associated with SDG 4 on education. At the level of global monitoring, the Inter-Agency and Expert Group on the Sustainable Development Goal Indicators (IAEG-SDGs) developed a global indicator framework which was agreed by the UN Statistical Commission in March 2016, further refined in March 2017 and formally adopted by the UN General Assembly in July 2017 (GA Resolution 71/313). This framework is seen as a voluntary and country-led instrument including an initial set of indicators to be refined annually and to be reviewed comprehensively by the Commission in 2020 and 2025.

The Technical Cooperation Group on SDG 4 indicators (TCG) was established in May 2016 to lead the development and implementation of the global and thematic indicator frameworks, providing a platform to discuss and develop the indicators used for monitoring the Education 2030 targets in an open, inclusive and transparent manner, involving the main stakeholders.

#### Objectives of the TCG

The TCG plays a crucial role in establishing standards and developing methodologies making recommendations on the necessary actions to improve data quality and availability<sup>1</sup>. Its main objectives are:

- SDG 4 global and thematic indicator framework development
- Other indicator development
- Quality assurance
- Support to global and regional entities
- Benchmarking process
- Reporting to the SDG 4 High-Level Steering Committee (HLSC) through its Functional Area 2 on data and monitoring.

## Ways of working of the TCG, rotation of members, and EDS Conference decisions

The TCG is **co-chaired by the directors** of the UNESCO Institute for Statistics (UIS) and the Global Education Monitoring (GEM) Report, and its **secretariat** is the UIS. The TCG is composed of **28 UNESCO Member States**. It also includes **observers**, notably from UNESCO, multilateral organizations, civil society organizations, UN regional economic commissions, and regional organizations, providing expert technical advice and support. Two **Sherpas** of the SDG 4 HLSC, who co-chair the Technical Committee of Functional Area 2 on data and monitoring, act as liaisons with the global education cooperation mechanism.

The work of the TCG is carried out by **Working Groups** (WG) focused on data sources and **Task Forces** (TF). The WGs generally develop standards, classifications, or norms and are composed of TCG members and non-members experts in the field or domain. The TFs are scope-specific, time-framed and focus on methodology; members of a TF provide vision, direction, and coordination of statistical activities in education.

Each selected TCG Member State serves for **three calendar years** and the latest <u>rotation of TCG</u> <u>members</u> was completed following the EDS Conference for the period 2024–2026<sup>2</sup>. The **Bureau** of the Conference was constituted of TCG members selected according to the <u>Rules of Procedure<sup>3</sup></u>.

The Conference endorsed the following **decisions** with regards to the TCG<sup>4</sup>:

- The TCG will be renamed 'Education Data and Statistics Commission' (EDS Commission)
- It will remain the primary body for the coordination of the global education data and statistics
- It will take forward the recommendations of the EDS Conference between sessions.

#### Objectives and expected outcomes of the meeting

**'TCG Working groups and workplans for 2024-2026'** marks the first TCG meeting in its new composition for 2024-2026 and will gather TCG members from the 28 Member States and the TCG co-chairs. It aims at:

- Initiating new TCG members to the work expected
- Defining the workplans of Working Groups and Task Forces based on the agenda set by the EDS Conference and its decisions
